
Gymnasium Renovations

Designed to equip lay members to lead, teach, facilitate church programmes; the Higher Certificate in Christian Ministry enable students to clearly articulate the teachings of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Additionally, the Higher Certificate in Christian Ministry will enable students to understand biblical literature in tandem with the development of an awareness of the basic principles of biblical literature interpretation.

Why the Higher Certificate in Christian **Ministry Matters?**

The Higher Certificate in Christian Ministry has been developed to train local church leaders in the following areas of church ministry:

- good The development \circ f communication skills for purposes of the presentation and preparation of sermons.
- · An awareness of the history of the church and the relation to the church's self-understanding and mission.
- Awareness of the organisational structure of the church and how it relates to the governance of the church.
- · The ability to function and relate appropriately across crossculturally and intergenerationally.
- An understanding of the different forms of evangelism and the ability to implement them in a church setting to achieve church growth.


HCHE Student Focus: Dingelihle Ngebe
